Dear Brethren.

It's always a joy to send a few updates on life down under. Recently Melinda joined me as I travel to the South Island and spent the first 6 days with me and then flew home and I had planned to continue traveling and visiting brethren and encouraging them together at the "Band of brothers" retreat with 10 of the brothers from around the Island. We decided to have some time together and visit some of the sites around Christchurch and then do the TranzAlpine train ride

owner/manager his name


