Pining for the Old or Planning for the New

Webster's Collegiate Dictionary defines *Pining* as, "Yearning intensely and persistently, especially for something unattainable." Listening to the current news about COVID, we hear the persistent question, "When are things going to return to normal?". After a year of COVID with its many restrictions and prohibitions, we have even resorted to referring to our lives pre-COVID as the old normal. In light of the current circumstances, the old normal has become something we considered good, something to be cherished, and something that we long for. Listening to enough news about COVID however, might even cause some to conclude that the old normal is something unattainable thus compounding their pining and deepening their despair. While there are certainly some things about the old normal that we as Christians should be missing such as all of us being able to assemble together for worship and praise, Bible study, and fellowship unincumbered by masks, social distancing, and the constant reminders of being present at a super spreader event, I think we should also be looking for and pursuing the opportunities in our current circumstances and planning for what will in many respects be a new normal post-COVID.

Marsha and I recently binge watched the entire first season of *The Chosen*, and while I was struck by several things that broadened by perspective on certain events and passages of scripture, one statement made by Jesus stood out among all the rest, at least for me. Jesus' disciples were challenging him regarding the way much of what he was doing was different and how it was making them uncomfortable and raising the ire of the religious sects. Jesus simply turned to them and said, "Get used to different." Now, you won't find that as a direct quotation from scripture but I think it is an excellent paraphrase of his statements in Matt. 5, where six times he makes statements similar to, "You have heard it said...But I say...". I firmly believe that, "Jesus Christ [the Word] is the same yesterday, today, and forever." (Heb. 13:8), and I am neither advocating for nor telling you about radical changes to come. I am simply saying that perhaps some of us are spending too much of our precious time pining for the old normal rather than looking for the opportunities God has placed before us today and preparing ourselves to serve God better in whatever our new normal looks like. "Get used to different", and make the most of it today and every day that God continues to give us breath.
