5. How do you see Jesus's commission differing from the other commissions given at the end of the other gospels?
6. John's gospel is very different from the other three. What are some things that have stood out the most to you about this particular gospel?
7. What are some ways that we can follow Jesus' commands of "feed my lambs" and "feed my sheep" today?
8. Why might Jesus have predicted Peter's death at that time?
9. Do you think that John's final words are a reference to how many miracles Jesus did or a reference to how we continue to be the church today and are an extension of Jesus's ministry and miracles?
