He called it "a blood transfusion for the soul" Risner began each day in prayer, lying on the floor with his head down the drain focusing on that single blade of grass. Perhaps the lesson for us is to get down and pray and focus on God. Choose to focus on faith rather than fear and on hope rather than despair and blessings rather than our immediate problems. Even when the problem isn't solved to our liking, when we focus on God, he lifts us above our circumstances and gives us peace in the midst of them.
